# Course Descriptions

## Aviation Disaster Response Workshop

**Prerequisite:** Fulfilling Our Mission

This course explains the American Red Cross roles and relationship to other responding agencies in providing emotional support to families under the Aviation Disaster Family Assistance Act of 1996.

## Bulk Distribution Operations

**Prerequisite:** Mass Care Overview

This is an interactive course where participants engage in scenarios to learn how to apply bulk distribution operations guidance.

## Client Casework: Providing Emergency Assistance

**Prerequisite:** Fulfilling Our Mission

Trains Red Cross caseworkers how to conduct effective client interview and provide appropriate assistance to help meet a client's immediate disaster-caused needs.

## Community Disaster Education (CDE) Workshop

**Prerequisite:** Fulfilling Our Mission

Learn how to present the different disaster preparedness programs and the content of the various materials.

## Disaster Action Team Workshop

**Prerequisite:** Fulfilling Our Mission

This workshop teaches the basic responsibilities of a Disaster Action Team member and prepares volunteers to become a member of the Red Cross initial response structure and to provide immediate care to victims of disaster.

## Disaster Frontline Supervisor & Simulation

**Prerequisite:** Experience as a Service Associate in area expected to become a supervisor

The purpose of this course is to prepare supervisors to lead a team of disaster workers to deliver high quality client service and to create a climate that promotes worker satisfaction.

## ERVs: Ready, Set, Roll

**Prerequisite:** Mass Care Overview, Valid driver's license, DMV print out, Driving Course Certificate (online)

This class provides learners with the opportunity to learn about and use an Emergency Response Vehicle (ERV) and all related equipment. The course consists of two parts that participants must complete: a self-study and an ERV orientation and road test.

## Foundations of Disaster Mental Health

**Prerequisite:** Fulfilling Our Mission, Licensed Professional

This class introduces participants to the key concepts, knowledge and skills required of anyone assigned to Disaster Mental Health (DMH).

## Fulfilling Our Mission

**Prerequisite:** Introduction to Disaster Services

The class introduces potential disaster volunteers and members of other local agencies to the role of the Red Cross in the community's actions in preparing for, responding to and recovering from emergencies and disasters.

## Fundamentals of Chapter Disaster Operations Management (New/Advance)

**Prerequisite:** Client Casework, Mass Care Overview, Fundamentals of Disaster Assessment, CEESD

This course is designed to train Disaster Services participants to perform the roles and responsibilities of directing a chapter disaster relief operation. The course provides participants an opportunity to apply their disaster knowledge, experience and critical thinking abilities to the challenges of developing and resourcing effective service delivery plans that meet the needs of the disaster-affected community.

## Health Services Response Workshop

**Prerequisite:** Fulfilling Our Mission, Licensed Professional

This course is designed to orient licensed health professionals to the roles and responsibilities of a Disaster health Services volunteer when working on behalf of the American Red Cross.

# Course Descriptions

## Introduction to Disaster Services

**Prerequisite:** Orientation

Introduces participants to Red Cross Disaster Services and ways they can become involved in a local chapter.

## Logistics: An Overview

**Prerequisite:** Fulfilling Our Mission

This course provides participants with an overview of the Material Support Services group and the activities associated with it.

## Logistics Simulation

**Prerequisite:** Logistics- An Overview

This simulation class is designed to provide learners with the opportunity to practice using skills and knowledge from Logistics: An Overview.

## Mass Care: An Overview

**Prerequisite:** Introduction to Disaster Services

Introduces potential disaster volunteers and members of other local agencies to the role of the Red Cross in the community's actions in preparing for, responding to and recovering from emergencies and disasters.

## Psychological First Aid

**Prerequisite:** Fulfilling Our Mission

This course provides a framework for understanding the factors that affect stress responses is disaster relief workers and the clients they serve.

## Shelter Operations

**Prerequisite:** Mass Care: An Overview

This course provides participants with knowledge of Red Cross policies and procedures for setting up, running and closing a shelter during a disaster.

## Shelter Simulation

**Prerequisite:** Shelter Operations

This Simulation class is designed for learners to acquire knowledge of Red Cross policies and procedures for setting up, running and closing a shelter during a disaster.

## Serving People with Disabilities

**Prerequisite:** Fulfilling Our Mission/Online component

Outlines policies and practices of the Red Cross related to providing services to people with disabilities following a disaster.
